Born and raised in the City of Mount Vernon in the state of New York, D'Andre attended the former Washington Performing Arts Magnet School, A.B. Davis Middle School, and Mount Vernon High School. Pastor James-Daniels is married to the lovely Mrs. Natalie Smith James-Daniels and father of four Nia, Maia, Dashana and D'Andre II.

Starting at a very young age he has been involved in numerous civic and religious organizations. His goal is to look at all situations and ask, "What can I do rather than what someone else should have done." Rev. D'Andre William James-Daniels earned his undergraduate degree in history from Livingstone College. While at Livingstone, D'Andre's God-anointed leadership gifts continued to be utilized and cultivated. He served as President of the Student Government Association for two consecutive

While serving Greater Centennial, he assisted with providing leadership to a congregation of 6,000 members and assisted with management of a 5 million dollar budget. In addition, his community activities has extended to his role as a Trustee for the Mount Vernon Board of Education where he served with the distinction of being the youngest person ever to be elected to a position of this magnitude in the City of Mt. Vernon, NY. Rev. James-Daniels has studied at the Union Theological Seminary of Columbia University in New York City, St. Paul School of Theology, Kansas City, MO and Hood Theological Seminary Salisbury, NC

Rev. James-Daniels has served as the successful pastor of the St. Matthew AME Zion Church, Kansas City, Mo. and the Historic Clinton Chapel AME Zion Church, Charlotte, N.C. "The Oldest Black Congregation in Mecklenburg County" and York Memorial AME Zion Church, Greenville, N.C. and currently serves as Pastor of The First AME Zion Church - Columbus, Ohio. Rev. James-Daniels has led these congregations in several significant renovation and restoration projects. In addition, his leadership and innovative ministry gifs has injected life into these historic congregations. Rev. James-Daniels has been used by God to serve as special assistant to the Mayor of his hometown Mount Vernon, NY. Noted for his acute ability to rightly divide the word of truth, Rev. James -Daniels has been gifted by God to attract a new generation of believers while not forsaking the truths of our faith. He currently serves as a full-time husband and father.
